- 1. We offer scholarships (both at a local level and a corporate level). The EWISP scholarship is an annual competition based program which awards more than \$200,000 in college scholarship money each year to qualifying high school seniors.

My EWI

When Fran asked me to write something about my experience with EWI, I found myself looking back on the 19+ years I have been a member. What I can say now that I have grey hair is that membership has meant very different things to me since joining.

An EWI of Calgary member, once said to me, "You bleed blue!" True enough, I did indeed for quite a long time. Hemorrhaged that lovely Navy and Teal in fact!

The first feeling I had about EWI was a sense of belonging and being sincerely welcomed by the Calgary Chapter President in 2002, **Danine Birkholm**. I felt like I had found a "safe place" to meet exceptional women and learn from them; not only as EWI mentors but as guides in business and life.

Calgary encouraged and supported me to grow and develop my leadership skills through chapter board service in pretty much every role there is. The only role I have never held in a Chapter or at the Corporate level has been Secretary/Treasurer, and I want to keep it that way, please and thank you.

Normally, a member's first exposure to Corporate is when they are Vice President of their own Chapter and get to travel to our annual Leadership Convention & Annual Meeting (LCAM). For me, it was a bit different as earlier that year our Corporate President at the time, **Debbie Taylor** travelled to Calgary. Something I said resonated with her and she asked me to conduct a session at LCAM that all on the ROI of Membership. I was touched and a little thrilled!

When I got back from LCAM I said to my sister, "Give me 5 years, and I will be Corporate President." Truth. It happened after three years of corporate board service. I was honored and still get am very proud to have served as Corporate President in EWI's 75th Anniversary year, 2012 – 2013.

The travel, laughter and experiences are one thing. A blessing! The friendships made though have been life-altering regardless of where or how I was serving.

Has it made me crazy at times? Absolutely. Have I given and given and given my time and effort to this organization? Absolutely. Why you ask? Because of this my friends...

Servant Leadership is not about having time. No one "has" the time. It's about MAKING the time.

At my Board retreat when I was the Calgary Chapter President, we landed on this phrase and I know they still use it today:

Learn, Lead, Mentor!

First you learn a role in EWI (serving on a committee or assisting the current Director when needed). Then you lead in the role as the Director and then, most importantly, you mentor the person coming behind you. Then you pick a different role to learn.

Chapter and Corporate Board service is a five-year commitment. Serve as a Director for two years (in different positions), then become the VP, then a year as President and year as Past President.

I still get thrilled when I see a Chapter using one of the tablecloths or pop up stands that I created as Marketing Director on the Corporate Board. I get a warm feeling whenever I see the logos that I helped create for all of our scholarship programs that are still used today. I am moved beyond belief and reassured that the VALUES of this organization are ones that I helped create at a board retreat one year in Aspen, CO.

Integrity/Excellence/Respect/Collaboration

I am proud of what I have accomplished as a member of this organization but not because it was me, it is because it was all done in collaboration with other women who shared the same vision and passion for EWI that I have. One thing EWI has taught me is that there is nothing a group of women cannot accomplish if they come together with a shared purpose and vision. It astounds me still what we collectively donate annually in scholarships. Last time I checked it was over \$600K USD each year! And that is just with 35 chapters now. When I joined way back when, we were almost 70 Chapter strong by the way. Amsterdam was just exiting.

It has been sad to see so many vibrant and healthy chapters fail over the years. Heart-breaking really. A Chapter cannot survive without new blood. Recruitment is everyone's responsibility.

In my Corporate Presidency I challenged each Chapter to just grow by 20% each year for five years. Easy, right? Can we gain two new members this year? I KNOW SO!

The pandemic has been devastating but I give full kudos to the members of the board that have remained calm and positive through it all!



If you were to ask any past leader in EWI, they would probably agree that board service is the most unappreciated role they have ever done. We need to always acknowledge and thank those who serve each and every day! And those that laid the groundwork too.

While you don't do it for recognition and praise, it is always nice to receive. Make board service the honor that it is. Treat those leading with respect and lend them your support as a member at large whenever called upon. It is all being done for the greater good of all.

I have pretty much achieved all you can achieve in EWI from Chapter Board service to Corporate Board service and back again and then founding our beloved EWI of Saskatoon five years ago! The only thing I have not done is close a chapter and I never want to see that happen...please!

EWI is what YOU make of it for your own journey. The most rewards though come through engagement with the organization at ALL levels but most important is to engage here at home first.

I feel so removed from you all right now but please know that I am your biggest champion and I cannot wait until I can attend a Chapter meeting in person again soon with all of you!




- Winter Jackets
