#### Executive Women International LCAM 2020 – Mobile App Download Instructions



The mobile app will allow you to:

- Join sessions and take your virtual experience with you on your phone or tablet
- Ask questions for speakers during sessions
- Access the participant Directory and favorite people you meet
- Message other attendees
- Contribute to the Discussion Wall
- Stay in the loop with event notifications





Here are a few tips:

- Log in to the app using your event profile to get access and sync your schedule and other selections between your desktop and mobile devices
- Make sure you enable notifications, so you don't miss out on timely information

We know that online events can sometimes be difficult to navigate and we want to make sure that you make the most of LCAM 2020 maximizing all the opportunities you would have had from the face to face event.

Here are some top tips to help you navigate the event and get the most out of this event.

#### In the lead up to the conference:

1. You will be relying on technology more than ever so, make sure to have the most recent version of zoom installed

2. Download the mobile App - here you will be able to engage with speakers, other attendees and our event sponsors.

3. Explore the App and desktop versions of the platform. Familiarize yourself with the content, highlight sessions and activities you don't want to miss and create your own schedule for the days as well as find fellow attendees and start working out who you'd like to connect with after the event.

4. Get posting to the event hashtags - **#LCAM2020 and #ewicorp** - ahead of time. Also, check out any speakers and start following them – or at least add them to a list. Chances are you'll get a better understanding of what they're about, which will probably help you think of some great questions to ask them.

#### Be prepared and engage early!

#### During the conference:

1. Log into sessions a few minutes early - this will give you time to avoid any login issues.

2. Ensure you are set up near your WiFi hub so that you don't have any connection issues during the sessions.

3. If you are using a mobile device such as a laptop, make sure that this is fully charged and that the charging cable is within reach.

4. Use the mobile App - this is going to be the best way to ask questions and engage in the live sessions. This way the conversation doesn't have to end when the session does.

5. Engage in the event - from meeting and chatting with your fellow attendees to joining in the social activities taking place around the live sessions. By being an extrovert and joining in the fun, you will no doubt end up meeting and engaging with your best new LinkedIn contacts!

#### Make the Most of Your Experience


Get the most out of Virtual Annual Conference:

1. Set up your social profile. Add your professional photo, update your contact info and select your privacy preferences. Tap and follow the login prompt.

Please use the email ID you used for registration.



- 2. Create your schedule. Tap Schedule and select sessions. To see your personalized schedule, tap Selected.
- 3. See who's attending by visiting the Directory. Favorite your connections to keep in touch this will carry through to year-round functions and future events. Tap *Directory*, select the person you want to favorite and tap the star icon.
- 4. **Take session notes.** Select your session and scroll to the *Notes* section to add content. You can export notes by tapping the share icon in the upper right corner.



5. **Direct message other attendees.** You can message attendees directly from the app. Tap *Directory*, select the person you want to message and tap *Send Message*. Note: You may only message attendees that have created their accounts and enabled others to contact them in this way.

Troy Cooper, M.O.M. Chief of Police, Saskatoon Police Service

Chief Cooper joined the Prince Albert Police Service in 1987 and graduated as the top academic recruit in 1988. After 31 years with Prince Albert, Chief Cooper was sworn to the office of the Chief of Police for the Saskatoon Police Service on February 28, 2018.

In addition to being awarded Exemplary Service and Protective Services medals, he is the recipient of the Saskatchewan Centennial Medal, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal and is a Member of the Order of Merit of the Police Forces.

Chief Cooper has a certificate in Police Leadership Administration from Dalhousie University, a Bachelor of Arts degree majoring in Criminal Justice from Athabasca University and a Masters of Business Administration focused on policing and security from Charles Sturt University. Chief Cooper is a graduate of the Canadian Police College Executive Development Program and the Senior Management Institute for Police at Boston University.

Chief Cooper is a Member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police and the Saskatchewan Association of Chiefs of Police. He sits on the National Police Services National Advisory Committee, the CACP Advisory Committee for the Order of Merit of the Police Forces, is the Chair of the Saskatchewan Association of Chiefs of Police Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls Committee, is the Chair of the Saskatchewan Chapter of the Interoperability Interest Group and a member of the Restorative Action Program Board of Directors.
